The Telecommunications Regulatory Authority (TRA) is looking to recruit a DNS Administrator to manage the domain servers for the .bh Country Code Top Level Domain (ccTLD). This role is an operational and technical role involved in managing a national ICT resource.

Main Responsibilities will include but will not be limited to:

- Daily operations and maintenance of Domain Name Registry servers;
- Monitor and maintain the transport and connectivity media of the system in co-operation with providers;
- Ensure all hosting services maintain the highest levels of availability and security;
- Establish and maintain good working relationships with third party technical teams responsible for remote/offshore secondary server hosting;
- Troubleshooting and resolving issues related to the DNS servers;
- Maintain supporting electronic transactions including WHOIS database lookups for .bh ccTLDs and online application processing;
- Planning, design and implementation of necessary changes, upgrades and maintenance operations to the Domain Name Registry platform.

The ideal candidate will:

- Have a degree/professional qualification in a relevant discipline
- Have at least 5 years professional experience
- Broad and deep understanding of TCP/IP technologies and protocols (e.g. TCP, DNS, ICMP, etc)
- Good working knowledge of DNS servers (MS DNS, BIND, etc) and DNS protocol in general
- Good exposure to datacenters, hosting platforms and network topologies
- Expertise with more than one operating system
- Have good interpersonal skills
- Able to work well under pressure and meet tight deadlines.
- Be Flexible, Accountable, Reliable, and maintain Confidentiality.
