EMERGENCY ORDER NO.5 OF 2010

BLOCKING OF WWW.SEEFCALL.COM

The Order

In the exercise of its powers under articles 3(b) 2 3(c) (1), 3(c) (18) and 24(c) of the Telecommunications Law, the Telecommunications Regulatory Authority (the Authority) makes the following Emergency Order.

All Licensees holding an Internet Services License issued by the Authority shall do the following:

- 1. Confirm by 4 pm on 3 October 2010 that the licensee will comply with this Emergency Order;**
- 2. Block the following website by 11:59pm on 3 October 2010;**

<http://www.seefcall.com/>
- 3. Confirm by 12 noon on 4 October 2010 that it has complied with the Emergency Order.**

Failure to comply with this Order will result in the Authority taking further regulatory action for breaches of the Telecommunications Law and Licenses.

Reasons for Order

The Authority has been alerted to the existence of www.seefcall.com.

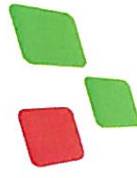
The website's applications enable a customer to subscribe to www.seefcall.com, buy credit over the website and make national and international calls from Bahrain using VoIP technology.

The website also offers a callback service to and from Bahrain, which is prohibited by article 24(c) of the Telecommunications Law.

www.seefcall.com is advertising its tariffs in Bahraini Dinar.

At its webpage <http://seefcall.com/onlineshop.html>, the site states that,

"Seef Call all rates are in BD (Bahraini dinar) and 1BD = 2.96US\$ included paypal charges. Bahraini dinar rates are specifically announced for our Middle East clients"

The webpage <http://seefcall.com/callback.html> provides an explanation of how the site's callback service works.

Based upon the above and after consideration of the Authority's position paper on the Regulation of Voice over Internet Protocol services, and in particular paragraphs 4.4 and 4.5, the Authority considers that Seef Call is specifically targeting its services at consumers in the Kingdom of Bahrain and is providing an unlicensed Public Telecommunications Service in the Kingdom of Bahrain in breach of article 24(a) of the Telecommunications Law¹.

The website also offers a callback service which is prohibited under article 24 (c) of the Telecommunications Law.

After consideration of the facts outlined above sufficient concerns have been raised with regards to the protection of the interests of Subscribers and Users and promotion of effective and fair competition amongst Licensed Operators, the above mentioned website should be blocked as soon as possible and the Authority hereby issues this Emergency Order.
